Dear Admissions Ambassador,

Thank you so much for helping with the phoning of prospective students prior to our first Open House on Thursday, October 27. I have included some print pieces to help with this project.

- **Grade School List**
- **Mock Phone Conversation**
- **Important Dates Sheet (please be very familiar with this info)**
- **Brochure/Inserts have very specific info on the school**
- **CD**

Phone calls should all be made in the next few weeks. After the open house I will send you a list of those families who were in attendance. I have included here the most frequently asked questions with our most common response. If you get stuck with an answer just leave me a message and I can get back to the family.

Can incoming 9th graders test elsewhere and still be considered for BSM? Yes, however, they must meet our application due date. Eighth graders should test at their "first choice" school. We will assume that we are the first choice of all those 8th graders who test with us. Also, students who test elsewhere would not be eligible for the Parent Association Award which is given to the top four students with the highest score. See the Important Date sheet for additional materials needed to complete the application.

Do incoming 7th graders have to take a test? Yes. All incoming 7th graders need to take the Iowa test of Basic Skills. We began testing all incoming 7th graders last year for the first time. (See Important Dates Sheet)

Will there be a waiting list?? What are the priorities regarding the waiting list? There have been waiting lists the last couple of years; however, most recently we have been able to place the majority of our Catholic grade school families. It is too early for us to know how many applicants we are going to have for fall 2006 and although we do give priority to siblings, children of alums and students coming from Catholic grade schools, they are not automatic. We do look at test scores, grades and get recommendations from their schools. The school does reserve the right to deny admission to students with severe emotional, behavioral and academic disabilities. It is possible we will have more applicants than we can take in February – we wait-list them and take them off as spots become available.

Please feel free to call me with any questions or concerns which may come up. I know our parents are our very best recruiters ... thanks for helping get the BSM story out to the community.

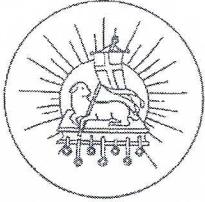

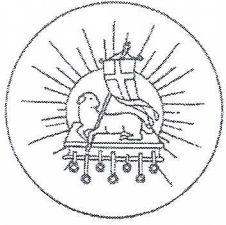

Sample Letter to Invite For Shadow and Open House

Dear Mr. and Mrs. Smith,

Thank you for your interest in Pope John Paul II High School.

Take a few moments to peruse the enclosed view book and materials and find out just how good a school can be. However, don't take my word for it. Take us up on the Spend-A-Day Program and have your daughter find out for herself.

I would like to review a few of the aspects that make Pope John Paul II High School so special.

Quality Academics: Teachers who care and students who have direction combine to produce enviable success rate. Over 90% of our students attend college annually. Jessica will be placed in levels according to her abilities

However, she will not be tracked. She may be in one level for English and another math. The idea is to challenge Jessica's strengths and work on her weaknesses.

Mr. and Mrs. Smith: It's very important for teenagers to spend four years with teachers who are happy to be; here and what to make a difference in their students' lives. Pope John Paul II High School instructors routinely spend many extra hours after school helping students find success. There are no girls, but you don't really notice or think about it because you are always with your friends, your brothers.

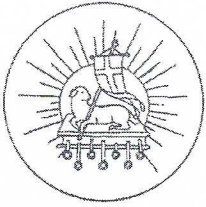

For the past two school years I have had the opportunity to teach at Catholic High School. It has been both an honor and a joy to work in an atmosphere that over the years I have grown to love.
